



Castle Medical Center in Hawaii will be offering an Orthopaedic Physical Therapy Residency Program starting in January 2010.

This is a one-year program providing advanced clinical and didactic training under direct mentorship. At the completion of the program, residents will have received the training to prepare them to apply for board certification as an orthopaedic clinical specialist in physical therapy. The program coordinator is a graduate of and former clinical faculty member of the Southern California Kaiser Permanente Orthopaedic Residency.

Residency Curriculum:

- Orthopaedic clinical practice in an outpatient setting
- One on one mentoring during clinical practice by the residency coordinator
- Didactic/lab instruction in orthopaedic physical therapy
- Resident directed learning activities including participation in physician clinics, community outreach, home study courses and research activities.

Physical Therapy at Castle Medical Center: In addition to our core practice at Castle treating individuals with orthopedic and neurologic disorders we also offer specialized services for individuals with vestibular disorders, incontinence, and lymphedema. Physical therapists will also work with individuals to prevent loss of mobility by developing fitness- and wellness-oriented programs for healthier and more active lifestyles. The Castle physical therapy team has worked closely with the Wellness & Lifestyle Medicine Center to develop exercise classes to help our clients continue successful exercise programs after discharge from therapy. We also offer aquatic therapy for our clients who have difficulty exercising on land especially those with painful joints or difficulty walking. Physical therapy services are provided to patients at Castle Medical Center, through Home Care services, and in the outpatient Performance and Rehabilitation Centers in Kailua and Kaneohe.
